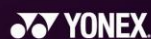

Koldinghus – Jutland's last royal castle

Jutland's last royal castle has played an important role in the history of Denmark throughout the more than 700 years of its existence. It has served as a part of the border defences, as a royal residence, and as the seat of the local representatives of the Danish central government. Following the disastrous fire of 1808, the castle ruin

attracted considerable attention as a picturesque ruin, providing a popular source of inspiration for artists and poets. For more than a century, the ruin has been the object of restoration programmes and gradual conversion to a museum of cultural history and a venue for cultural activities. www.koldinghus.dk



Trapholt – Museum of Modern Art and Design

Trapholt is located in Southern Denmark on the mainland of Jutland and is one of the largest and most popular museums in Denmark, outside of Copenhagen. Trapholt opened in 1988 and added additional exhibition space and collection storage in 1996. The international architecture competition held in 1982, was won by the project team of architects Boje Lundgaard and Bente Aude, lighting designer Sophus Frandsen and landscape architect Svend Kirkegaard, for its exceptional museum design and its extraordinary and sensitive placement in nature. The Museum is set in a beautiful sculpture park overlooking the water of Kolding Fjord and visitors come from far and near, not only to see the amazing array of exhibitions,

performances and programs but also to experience the museum's architecture, the one-of-a-kind summerhouse designed by Arne Jacobsen, to find unique design treasures in the museum shop and to become culinarily tempted in the restaurant with its breathtaking view.

At Trapholt visitors will be welcomed by TRAPguides that are trained to help assist and offer the visitors guided tours of the museum, tours of Arne Jacobsen's summerhouse, and introductions to current exhibitions. Also at Trapholt, we make sure to always have a varied range of options and activities for children and their accompanying adults.

Christiansfeld - City Tour in Christiansfeld

Come on a conducted tour of Christiansfeld with a guide, who tells about the Moravian Brethren in Christiansfeld in an inspiring way and about the honey cakes, which the town is famous for.

Gathering at the Church Square with the Well

A conducted tour of Christiansfeld takes us down the straight streets past the beautiful buildings. We are going to visit the church of the Moravian Brethren and the cemetery "God's Field", where it is quite a special feeling to walk down the perpendicular paths framed in lime trees.

Christiansfeld is a Wonderful Town

The town was planned and built 230 years ago by the Moravian Brethren as the headquarters of the Moravian Brethren in Denmark and is named after King Christian VII.

Architecturally seen the like of Christiansfeld is not seen in Denmark. A strict and harmonic architecture forms the framework of a calm and green town.

With its straight streets and beautiful buildings and the outstanding and beautiful church square,

Christiansfeld is an architectural gem.

The Church of the Moravian Brethren

The church is characterized by simplicity. The large room (the Hall) is the largest church hall in Denmark without supporting beams and can seat approximately a thousand people.

The decoration is relatively simple. The large hall is all white, without altar, baptismal font and painting. The only decoration are the old hand-forged chandeliers from 1776. The wooden floor is untreated and sanded. There is no pulpit, however, there is a liturgy table.

The Cemetery God's Field

The cemetery of the Moravian Brethren is laid out in the shape of a cross with wide perpendicular paths framed in lime trees. There are no family burial-places, the sisters are buried to the right and the brethren are buried to the left - exactly as the congregation are seated in the church. The graves are identical as a symbol that after death all are equal.

Givskud zoo - Zootopia

Givskud zoo, or the Lion Park as it was originally known, was founded in 1969 by Jacob Hansen. Jacob Hansen, who owned a small zoo in the town of Vejle, drew inspiration from Europe for the first Danish safari park with free-roaming lions. Despite a number of teething problems, and notwithstanding the initial scepticism of the authorities, Givskud Lion Park first opened its doors on 12 August 1969 and became an overnight success.

More animals appear

The idea of letting visitors experience the animals moving freely around in large enclosures proved to be extremely popular. Over the next few years, the Lion Park was extended to include a number of other species. At the time, the concept represented a novel alternative to the more traditional urban zoos. The present-day GIVSKUD ZOO, with its large enclosures, has proved to be one of the best and most dignified ways to keep larger species in captivity.

Independent institution

Following his death in 1971, Jacob Hansen's family continued to manage the Lion Park until 1983. The park then became an independent institution

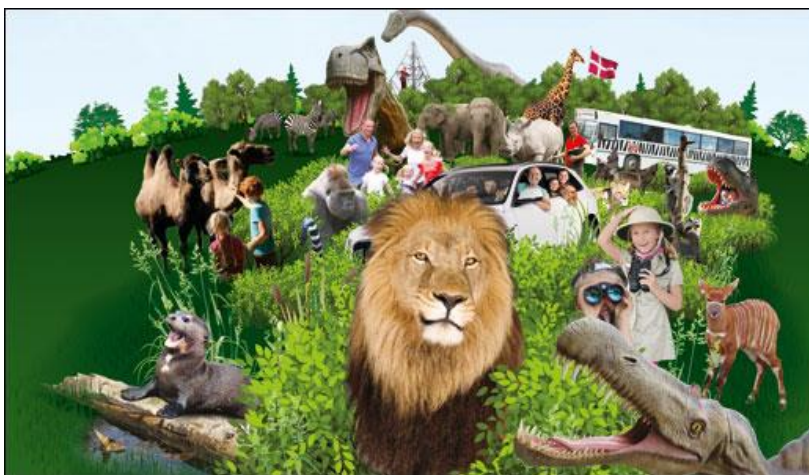
and changed its name to GIVSKUD ZOO. GIVSKUD ZOO was officially recognised by the State in 1989, and the park now receives an annual grant from the Danish Ministry of Culture.

The gorilla effect

In 1998 GIVSKUD ZOO received a family of gorillas from Copenhagen Zoo, and the new inhabitants proved to be a real crowd-puller. No fewer than 441,000 people visited the park that year – still the highest number ever recorded! Samson, the big male gorilla, and his family became national celebrities when a series of programmes on Danish television followed their move from Copenhagen to Givskud.

Present and future

Over the past few years, the rhinos have moved into a new, modern stable, and two 'small' rhino babies have already seen the light of day here. A new lemur enclosure was built in connection with EAZA's Madagascar campaign. The enclosure is home to both ring-tailed lemurs and red-fronted brown lemurs. At the end of 2007, work began on a new development plan that will serve as a roadmap for the future development of GIVSKUD ZOO.
